Metropolitan Musical Theatre Company Monteverdi Singers As the end of the church liturgical year approaches (Reign of Christ will be celebrated on November 20th) and as Christmas approaches (the first Sunday in Advent is November 27th), I find myself reflecting yet again on Edwina Gateley's psalm, "Glimpsing God." I find it resonates with my deepest religious thoughts for this time of the year. In Jesus we get an elusive glimpse of God. It is a mysterious glimpse which I find we can never fully comprehend but it keeps drawing us back calling up hopes and touching upon



dreams which are of the very essence of our lives. Edwina Gateley has written a number of psalms and other reflective pieces which I also find powerful in their ability to speak to me. This psalm comes from her book, *Psalms of a Laywoman*.

GLIMPSING GOD

I catch a glimpse, Now and then, Of God. A swift passing Sweetness Which makes light The hour, the day, the week. Elusive. inconstant. Yet never totally absent From the hurtling days With their shadows. I grieve That such a beautiful Awareness. Like an unexpected visitor. Comes infrequently, Entertains briefly, And passes With a whisper. Is lost then In the laughter And the music Of the night.

Like last year we will have a Christmas tree in the church during Advent and Christmas. That is, for the Sundays November 27th to January 1st as there is only one Sunday (apart from Christmas Day) in the Christmas season this year.

During Advent many of us have an Advent calendar on which we note each passing day as Christmas approaches. This year I am hoping that, as a gesture of solidarity with those who are much less fortunate that ourselves, each one of us will, each day, put aside one grocery item to be donated to Uniting Communities in the new year and then, on each of the Sundays of Advent, bring along our seven items to be placed at the foot of our Christmas tree. This is a simple but useful way of helping to care for those who find no room at the inn.

Let me finish with these words of Janet Morley. "As we remember the coming of the Christ child, let us be aware that he may not come now in the form of a baby, but as a stranger, a beggar, a member of our family in distress, as an enemy, a soldier, someone who

oppresses our people . . . But these may be hiding the face of Christ. We must offer what is each person's basic need – the need for acceptance, whoever we are and whatever we have done We have to hold our doors open.
