FROM THE MINISTER:

How to know a person

I have recently finished reading the book 'How to Know a Person' by David Brooks. It is subtitled 'The Art of Seeing Others Deeply and Being Deeply Seen'. Brooks explores the skill of understanding and connecting with others beyond surface interactions. The book guides readers through how to foster deeper human connections in



various aspects of life, including family, work, and broader social interactions. It highlights the importance of empathy, the barriers that prevent us from connecting with others, and how deep understanding can transform relationships.

It has been described as "a blend of philosophical reflection and actionable advice, aiming to equip readers with the tools needed for more profound, empathetic, and enriched interactions with others."

It had me thinking about how Jesus exemplifies the ideal of deep seeing; knowing someone beyond surface-level interactions, which leads to profound personal transformation.

The story of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well (John 4:4-26) came to mind. Jesus' knowledge of the woman's life and his non-judgmental approach allowed her to open up and feel truly seen.

In a world bustling with superficial interactions, how often do we truly see and understand one another?

Just as Jesus recognised the woman's thirst for something greater than water, Brooks encourages us to look for the deeper needs and hopes in those we meet.

Just like Jesus, who offered living water to quench the woman's deeper thirst, we are called to offer understanding and empathy to nourish the souls of those around us.

We can do this by trying to understand the feelings and perspectives of others without immediately offering advice or judgment. When interacting with others, ask thoughtful questions that encourage them to share more about their lives. Reflect on how their experiences might feel.

It also had me think about the story of the two men on the road to Emmaus who encounter the risen Jesus. Reading this in a literal sense, one way of interpreting this passage might be to say that because they were so caught up in their own thoughts for a large part of the journey they missed seeing, knowing, Jesus in their midst.

May we strive to see each other, and others, beyond the immediate, to understand more than just the surface. Like Jesus with the Samaritan woman, may we offer this gift of understanding to each other, making connections that reflect Christ's love in our community and to those we meet along the road.
