FROM THE MINISTER:

I've been thinking about all the opportunities we get in this life to do amazing things. What is our response when we face challenges and opportunities in our lives?



I've been drawn to the story of Moses, because I believe it offers us some wisdom on embracing the path laid before us.

Moses began his journey in circumstances that seemed far from promising, yet a basket carried him into the arms of the Pharaoh's daughter. Raised as an adopted prince in Egypt, he faced the stark reality of his people's oppression. He fought against it with his own idea of justice and became a wanted man, fleeing from Egypt and settling as a shepherd, far away from the life he knew. However, it was through an extraordinary encounter with a burning bush that Moses was presented with a profound opportunity - one that would define his legacy.
