#### FROM THE MINISTER:

Many of you would be aware of the changes afoot for me as this year draws to a close. Not just for myself, but for Pastor Andrew and the congregation too. For those not aware, I am concluding my Placement as Chaplain at



Prince Alfred College to take up two positions in the Synod Placements and Safe Church Team. In fact, I have already started in the Synod office. Having had most of last term off with long service leave, I have returned this term, split 50/50 between the Synod office and PAC/Wesley Church.

Having been in placement at PAC for over 15 years now, it's been a while since I've had to do farewells – at least my farewells. 15 years has seen a lot of people come and go, and change, too, for that matter. It's now time for a change for myself.

As I have alluded, this means a change for the Wesley congregation. The decision has been made to conclude the ministry supply arrangement that has been in place since June 2022 between the College and congregation. This arrangement will end at the end of December.

That's where it means a change for Pastor Andrew too. His placement will not continue beyond the end of the year.

Change can be unsettling. Particularly when one feels they have little or no control of the change happening around them. In moments when we feel helpless, tossed by forces beyond our control, the world around us can seem like shifting sand, leaving us struggling to find stability.

John 14 offers a powerful reassurance in these times: Jesus tells his disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me." This verse speaks to the solace found in faith—a steadying force when everything else feels uncertain.

In a book I came across whilst browsing at Dillons on The Parade last year, The Journey by James Norbury, we are invited to see change through the eyes of two characters, Big Panda and Tiny Dragon, who, like us, encounter both wonder and discomfort as they move through life's shifting landscapes. The two characters remind us that even the most unsettling changes can lead to growth, new perspectives, and moments of quiet wisdom. The Panda, with gentle encouragement, often helps the Dragon to see that uncertainty is not necessarily something to fear but an essential part of discovery.

Jesus's words remind us that even in the most disorienting changes, we are not alone. His promise of peace is not the kind that removes change or turbulence from our lives but rather the assurance that God is with us through them. God remains constant when everything else shifts, a source of strength and presence we can rely on. When facing transitions beyond our control, embracing this peace can help us navigate with a spirit of trust, finding hope even in the unfamiliar.

As each of you, us, continue to journey on, in whatever the near and distant future may hold, may the peace of God be with you. Always.
