

FROM PASTOR ANDREW KIESELBACH To the Wesley Kent Town Community,

Thank you for your prayers over the last months as I looked for direction as to where God would have me next. I wanted to let you know I have accepted a role at Hills Christian Community School in Verdun. FUTURE MINISTRY

Since 1st January 2025, Wesley Uniting Church Kent Town officially has not had a minister in placement. Late last year, the Church Council prepared a Congregational Placement Profile which was approved by the Wimala Presbytery (of which this church is a member) and the Synod of SA, and the vacancy is listed. Available ministers are open to apply for the position.

Unfortunately, there is a shortage of ministers and a number of other Uniting Churches are also without a minister in placement. It may take a while until a new minister is appointed to our church.

What does this mean for us? Sunday Worship Services and all our community activities will continue as usual. The Church Council will ensure that a preaching roster is maintained. This requires a bit of work on our part, but that is our undertaking. There is a possibility that an Interim Minister may be appointed until a permanent minister is found.

What can we do? Remember that we, the members of the Congregation, are the church. Let us remain firm in our faith, worship together, pray for one another and trust in God. In this 160th Anniversary Year, let us continue to serve God and serve our community, and ensure that this church has a meaningful presence both now and into the future.
